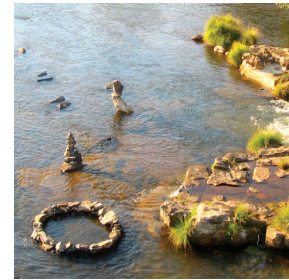

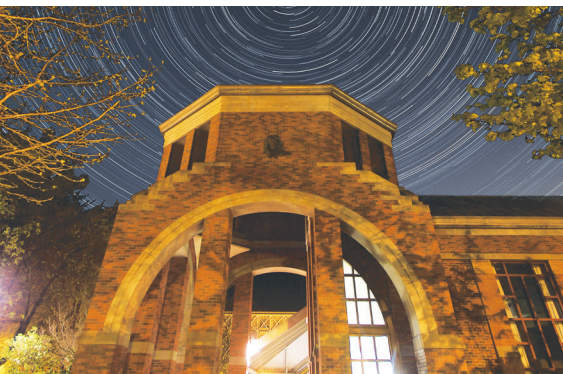

DISTANCE EDUCATION

The Distance Education program offers a variety of online courses, allowing students to earn UO credit from anywhere that Internet access is available. Located in Charleston, Oregon OIMB offers a variety of courses during the summer term. In addition to the eight week term, several two week, and weekend workshops are available as well. Courses are open to qualified students from all institutions as well as those interested in continuing education. Courses meet for at least seven hours a day and are designed for upper-division biology majors, environmental studies/science majors, and graduate students in these disciplines.

CENTRAL OREGON

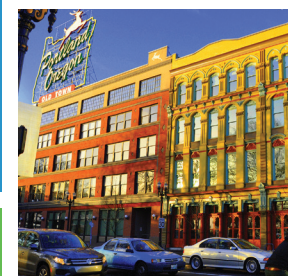

Financial Aid

Summer aid is primarily made up of loans, and to a limited extent, grants and work-study. To be eligible, you must be admitted to the University of Oregon and enrolled in a degree or eligible certificate program. If you are a continuing student, you must be in good academic standing to receive financial aid.

For Summer 2014 aid a student must have filled out the 2013-2014 FASFA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) form. In addition, there is a separate application for summer aid. For deadlines and more detailed information visit the Summer Financial Aid page: financialaid.uoregon.edu/summer_aid

Nonadmitted and recently graduated students are not eligible for financial aid.

Summer Housing

Summer 2014 is going to be an exciting time around the residence halls. A myriad of groups will also be staying in campus housing for conferences, camps, and meetings. The residence halls will help you stay connected during the summer and class is only a few minutes away.

You must be registered for credit courses to be eligible to stay in university housing during summer term. Housing can be at a premium during the summer, so apply early to ensure a room. The 2014 Summer Session Room and Board Rates are available online.

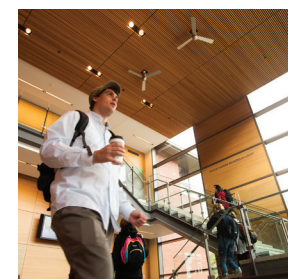
